English; Ingles; Anglais: **Working towards the elimination of crimes against women and girls committed in the name of honor.** United Nations General Assembly Resolution A/C.3/59/L.25: 15 October 2004

In October 2004 the United Nations General Assembly passed an historic Resolution on the elimination of crimes against women and girls committed in the name of honor. Known as Crimes of Honor, the Resolution stressed the need to treat all forms of violence against women and girls, including crimes committed in the name of honor, as a criminal offence, punishable by law; emphasized such crimes are incompatible with all religious and cultural values; called upon all States to continue to intensify efforts to prevent and eliminate crimes against women and girls committed in the name of honor, which takes many different forms, by using legislative, administrative and programmatic measures; and requests the Secretary-General to report on the implementation of the present resolution in his report on the question of violence against women to the General Assembly at its sixtieth session.

## **Statement - UN Special Rapporteur on Trafficking in Persons, Especially in Women and Children**

On 12 March 2009 the United Nations Human Rights Council heard the report submitted by the Special Rapporteur on trafficking in persons, especially women and children, Joy Ngozi Ezeilo (A/HRC/10/16), which provides a global perspective of the trafficking phenomenon and its trends, forms and manifestations. It looks at the definition of trafficking, as articulated in the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons Especially Women and Children, and outlines the scope of the mandate. The report also examines the legal and policy framework, especially the human rights frameworks and mechanisms, for combating trafficking in persons at international, regional and national levels.

The right "to leave" a country, laid down in Article 13 (2) of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, has no corresponding right "to enter" a country. This apparent contradiction has produced a publication, edited by two unesco programme specialists on international migration. It attempts to explore the scenario of a world where migration knows no borders. Given the current context of strict border controls and a heightened social and political awareness of the issue, this scenario of a world where each person would be free to move around from one country to another and settle wherever he or she chooses, may appear somewhat utopian. But today's Utopia could become tomorrow's reality and this publication attempts to analyse the ethical and economic challenges as well as the social consequences of totally free movement all over the world.

PRESS RELEASE - Istanbul, Turkey (April 6, 2009) - Youth around the world are invited to participate in a dynamic video competition on issues surrounding migration and diversity. PLURAL + is organized by the Alliance of Civilizations (AoC) and the International Organization for Migration (IOM) in collaboration with a number of organizations, including the Anna Lindh Foundation, Baka Forum, Chih India, the Royal Film Commission of Jordan and the Media That Matters Film Festival.
